TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Mark 9:23-24

Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes."

Immediately the father of the child cried out and said with tears, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!"

TRUTHS/NUGGETS

1. Job prayed with sacrificial offerings over his children
2. **Job 1:5** When the days of feasting had completed their cycle, Job would send and *consecrate them*, rising up *early in the morning* and *offering burnt offerings* according to the *number of them all*; for Job said, "*Perhaps my sons* have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." *Thus Job did continually.*
3. He consecrated his children.
4. He made early morning offerings.
5. According to the number of the children, he made offerings, sacrifices.
 6. He was concerned about his sons - just in case they sinned.
 7. He did it continually.
 8. Faith starts at home.
9. The children of great kingdom pioneers need a wall of prayer to protect them.
10. Mark 9:24 Immediately the father of the child cried out and said with tears, "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!" Much of my prayer for my children have been "Lord I believe, help
